Dear Mr. Humphries:

On November 9, 2021, the Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations contained in the complaint filed by you on October 5, 2018. The Commission dismissed the allegations that: Katherine E. Arrington and Katie Arrington for Congress and Kathleen Randall, in her official capacity as treasurer (the "Committee"), violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a) by knowingly accepting a prohibited in-kind contribution; the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b) by failing to report a contribution; Matthew Eby, as Director of Fix Our Flooding, and Executive Director of 1st Street Foundation, Inc., violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a) by consenting to the making of a prohibited in-kind contribution; Fix Our Flooding, Inc. and 1st Street Foundation, Inc. violated 52 U.S.C. § 30120(a) by failing to include an appropriate disclaimer. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
