Dear Mr. Bayes and Ms. Fort:

On October 12, 2018, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Katherine E. Arrington and Katie Arrington for Congress and Kathleen Randall, in her official capacity as treasurer (the “Committee”), of a complaint alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the complaint was forwarded to your clients at that time.

Upon further review of the allegations in the complaint and information supplied by respondents, the Commission, on November 9, 2021, voted to dismiss the allegations that Katherine Arrington and the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a) by knowingly accepting a prohibited in-kind contribution, and that the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) by failing to report the contribution. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
