This is in reference to the complaint you filed with the Federal Election Commission on October 22, 2018, concerning Citizens for Waters and David Gould in his official capacity as treasurer ("Committee"), Maxine Waters, and Families & Teachers for Antonio Villaraigosa for Governor 2018 ("Families & Teachers"). Based on that complaint, on November 9, 2021, the Commission voted to dismiss the allegations that the Committee and Maxine Waters violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) and dismiss the allegation that Families & Teachers violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(a)(1)(A) and closed the file in this matter. One or more Statements of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision may follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
