On May 6, 2019, and August 14, 2019, the Federal Election Commission ("Commission") notified your client Coalition for a Safe Secure America of complaints alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and the Commission's regulations. The Commission has considered the allegations raised in the complaints and determined to dismiss those allegations. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter on April 8, 2021. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision will follow.
