Dear Mr. Woodhouse:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaints dated January 28, 2019, but there was an insufficient number of votes to determine whether or not there was reason to believe that Respondents violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). Accordingly, on September 6, 2022, the Commission closed the files in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision is enclosed.

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The Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
