On November 9, 2021, the Federal Election Commission (“Commission”) reviewed the information provided in your complaint dated February 13, 2019, alleging violations of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the “Act”), and determined to dismiss the allegation that Howard Schultz violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102(e)(1), 30103, and 30104 by failing to register and report as a candidate. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). If the Commission issues a Factual and Legal Analysis or Statement of Reasons explaining the basis for its decision, it will be provided to you.
