Dear Mr. Shur:

On January 23, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, David Trahan, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On January 10, 2023, the Commission found, on the basis of the information in the complaint and information provided by you, that there is no reason to believe that David Trahan violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(a)(1)(A) by making excessive contributions in the form of loans to Lori Trahan and Lori Trahan for Congress Committee and Maria Cunha in her official capacity as treasurer. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons providing the basis for the Commission's decision will follow.
