Dear Ms. Jing:

On May 30, 2019, the Federal Election Commission notified you of a complaint alleging that you violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the complaint was forwarded at that time. On July 28, 2022, the Commission decided to exercise its prosecutorial discretion and to dismiss the allegations that you violated 52 U.S.C. § 30122 by making contributions in the name of another. The Commission also decided to exercise its prosecutorial discretion to dismiss the allegations that you violated 52 U.S.C. § 30121(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.20(h)(1) by providing substantial assistance to foreign nationals making prohibited contributions. The Commission has closed the file. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
