Dear Mr. Reimer:

On May 30, 2019, the Federal Election Commission notified you of a complaint alleging that the Republican National Committee and Ronald C. Kaufman in his official capacity as treasurer (the “RNC”) violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the complaint was forwarded to the RNC at that time. On July 28, 2022, the Commission decided to exercise its prosecutorial discretion and dismiss the allegations that the RNC violated 52 U.S.C. § 30121 by accepting foreign national contributions. The Commission has closed the file. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission’s decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
