
Dear Mr. Long:

On August 1, 2019, your clients, Friends of Ralph, Ralph G. Torres, the Ralph G. Torres Campaign, Angel A. Demapan, and Angel Demapan for House, were notified that the Federal Election Commission found reason to believe that they violated certain provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the “Act”). On October 20 and November 1, 2019, Friends of Ralph, Ralph G. Torres, and the Ralph G. Torres Campaign submitted responses to the Commission’s reason to believe findings. After considering the circumstances of the matter, the Commission determined on August 27, 2024, to take no further action as to Friends of Ralph, Ralph G. Torres, the Ralph G. Torres Campaign, Angel A. Demapan, and Angel Demapan for House, and voted to close the file in this matter effective October 3, 2024. Any applicable Statements of Reasons available at the time of this letter’s transmittal are enclosed.
