Dear Mr. Stanley:

On August 7, 2019, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients of a complaint alleging that Troy Balderson and Balderson for Congress and J. Matthew Yuskewich in his official capacity as treasurer had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On September 28, 2021, the Commission considered the complaint but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that Balderson and Balderson for Congress and J. Matthew Yuskewich in his official capacity as treasurer violated the Act. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision will follow.
