20 21 22 23 24 25 26 27	Spano ("Span for Congress a 52 U.S.C. §§ 3 and violated 1 The Commiss	On February 9, 2023, the Commission found reason to believe that: (1) Vincent Ross Spano ("Spano") violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) by accepting excessive contributions; (2) Ross Span for Congress and Robert Phillips, III in his official capacity as treasurer ("Committee") violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30116(f) and 30104(b)(3) by accepting excessive contributions and misreporting loans and violated 11 C.F.R. § 103.3(b)(3) by failing to make timely refunds of excessive contributions. ¹ The Commission also authorized pre-probable cause conciliation for Vincent Ross Spano and Ross Spano for Congress and its treasurer. ²
