This is in reference to the complaint you filed with the Federal Election Commission on August 5, 2019, concerning Susan B. Anthony List Inc. Candidate Fund and Jennifer Gross in her official capacity as treasurer, The Lukens Company, and Robert J. Kania, II. Based on that complaint, on November 9, 2021, the Commission voted to dismiss the allegation that the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b) and 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a), dismiss the allegation that The Lukens Company violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a), and to find no reason to believe that Robert J. Kania, II, violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, and closed the file in this matter. One or more Statements of Reasons explaining the Commission's decisions may follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
