On November 9, 2021, the Federal Election Commission considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated August 9, 2019, and found no reason to believe that Joaquin Castro violated 52 U.S.C. § 30111(a)(4) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.15(a). Accordingly, on November 9, 2021, the Commission closed the file in this matter.
