Dear Mr. Backer:

On December 2, 2021, the Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations contained in the complaint you submitted on behalf of political.law PLLC, dated August 28, 2019. On the basis of the information provided in your complaint, and information provided by the respondents, the Commission found no reason to believe that Christine O'Donnell and Friends of Christine O'Donnell and Christopher M. Marston in his official capacity as treasurer are about to violate 52 U.S.C. § 30114(b) and 11 C.F.R. § 113.1(g)(3). Accordingly, on December 2, 2021, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons explaining the basis for the Commission's decision will follow.
