Attached is a news article from Dec. 2017 indicating Sheriff Nehls confirmed he paid for polling services for his potential candidacy. This indicates his exploratory activities have been active for an extensive time period.

Also attached are recent news articles where Sheriff Nehls indicates he will not officially file for office so he can fulfill his term as Sheriff.

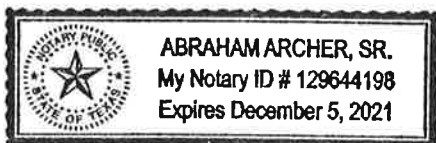
He continues to use his current elected position for fundraising although he officially announced he would not run for reelection as Sheriff on July 11, 2019. A fundraiser Golf Tournament is planned for November 11, 2019. The flyer indicates political advertising is paid for by "Friends of Sheriff Nehls". A search of Texas campaign committees and the FEC finds no results for this committee. A search of the named Treasurer, Chad Norvell returns a Finance Report for "Troy Nehls" Officeholder "Sheriff".

Fort Bend County Sheriff Troy E. Nehls is considering running for Congress, and has hired a firm to poll residents on their thoughts on the matter.

The pollsters ask residents whether they vote Republican, have conservative values, and what they think of Republican President Donald Trump and Texas Sen. Ted Cruz and District 22 Rep. Pete Olson.

The callers also ask residents what they think of the job Nehls has done as sheriff and whether they would consider voting for him if he runs against Olson.

The polling firm would not say it was working on Nehls' behalf, but Nehls confirmed Friday the polsters were working for him.

He said the polling firm will provide him with the results of the survey later Friday.



Nehls announced earlier this year that he had formed an exploratory committee to help him decide whether to seek the House seat.

He told The Herald on Friday that he would announce his decision on Wednesday.

RICHMOND, Texas (KTRK) -- Outgoing Fort Bend County Sheriff Troy Nehls is staying put in office after he claimed a "witch-hunt" in the county commissioners' court wanted him out before his term expires next year.

The outspoken sheriff, who this past summer announced he will not seek another term, revealed in a tweet that a meeting was set Tuesday to discuss his possible ouster.

He further said the move was politically motivated.

"The Dem County Judge has even met with other Dems to choose who 'he' would appoint to replace me. I've done nothing wrong. A Dem-led witch-hunt has now entered FBC. Sad!" Nehls tweeted.

At issue, according to the court, was Nehls' decision to form an exploratory committee for a U.S. House run and whether that broke any rules for a sitting elected official.

It's related to what's called "right to run." If you hold an elected position, like Sheriff Nehls, and have 13 months or more on your term and then announce plans to run for a different office, you must resign immediately. Nehls has more than 13 months on his term but hasn't announced plans to run for another position. He has said he's formed an exploratory committee.

Commissioners told ABC13 that no action was taken since there weren't any laws broken.

Nehls reaffirmed that he is, at least for the moment, not running for Congress, but simply exploring the proposition.

"I have no intent and I will not resign my position as sheriff to run for Congress. I've never said I was running for Congress. I formed an exploratory committee and I'm testing the waters. I'm seeing over the next 60 days, would I be a viable candidate for Congress," the sheriff explained.

So what brought up the court meeting with Nehls' position on the agenda? According to Fort Bend County Judge KP George, a constituent raised concerns over whether Nehls was in his position illegally.

"We wanted to make sure that the constituent e-mail, whether it was valid, whether there was no value to it, we wanted to be absolutely clear about it. So our county attorney advised this. The best way to this: put on the agenda and discuss in closed session. And that's exactly what we did," George said.

Still, Nehls had another concern.

"I've heard, just through the rumor mill, is that our county judge is out there talking to other individuals about the potential appointment as the Fort Bend County sheriff," said Nehls.

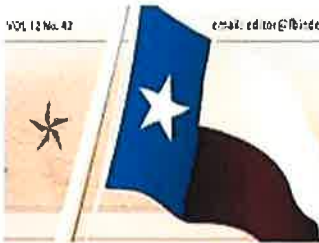
The judge said that's not true and he has many other things to focus on.

"Absolutely not, that's also my job," said George. "It's not my job to find the next Fort Bend sheriff in case there's a vacancy."

Back in July, Nehls stated he would not seek another term as sheriff after seven years in office. He was the Fort Bend County Precinct 4 constable for two terms before that. Shortly after the decision, he formed an exploratory committee to seek the U.S. House seat in Texas District 22.

During his time as sheriff, Nehls ran into controversy in 2017 when he was involved in a situation involving a woman who had a "F(expletive)" sign displayed on her truck.

Vote "Yes" to say "No" (to state income tax)

Come Nov. 3, Texans will have an election and ten Constitutional amendments will be on the ballot. There are no other statewide political issues. However, at county and city levels there are elections.

In Fort Bend County, all registered voters can vote on a bond election for flood control mitigation, in addition to the Constitutional amendments.

There will be a special election for the Texas House District 25 seat, vacated by Dr. John Zerby.

The City of Sugar Land will have its own \$90 million bond election for drainage, public safety, streets and animal shelter.

The City of Missouri City will have elections for its four district council seats.

A portion of Houston in Fort Bend County will vote in city of Houston mayor and city council elections.

Early voting starts Oct. 21.

Turning to the Constitutional amendments, the most significant item is Proposition 4. Prohibiting a state individual income tax.

The Texas Constitution requires all taxation in the state to be equal and uniform.

It allows the Legislature to impose by general law a net income tax on individuals, including an individual's share of partnership and unincorporated association income, only if approved by a majority of registered voters voting in a statewide referendum.

It also requires that at least two-thirds of net revenue collected under an income tax be used to reduce the rate of maintenance and operation taxes levied to fund public education.

Proposition 4 would be added to the Texas Constitution to prohibit the Legislature from imposing a net income tax on individuals, including an individual's share of partnership or unincorporated association income.

The ballot proposal reads: "The constitutional amendment prohibiting the imposition of an individual income tax, including a tax on an individual's share of partnership and unincorporated association income."

Supporters say that Proposition 4 would help keep the Texas economy strong by ensuring that the state could not impose an individual income tax, sending a message that Texas was committed to maintaining a business-friendly, low-tax

economic environment. The lack of an individual income tax in Texas is part of the low-tax, pro-growth approach that has fueled the state's robust economic expansion.

It also helps attract families and businesses relocating from other parts of the country and seeking relief from burdensome taxes. Prohibiting an income tax would safeguard the state's continued prosperity, as income and capital accumulation are critical to economic growth.

The introduction of an individual income tax would discourage savings, investment, productivity, job creation, and economic growth in the state.

It also would increase the size of the state government at the expense of individual liberty and result in higher costs to the taxpayer. Constitutionally prohibiting an income tax would help prevent this growth in state bureaucracy.

Although the Texas Constitution already requires a proposed income tax be approved by voters in a referendum, it does not explicitly prohibit such a tax.

This proposition would make it clear once and for all that the state could not impose an individual income tax, protecting both taxpayers and the state's economic expansion.

Proposition 4 would not endanger the state's revenue stream, as Texas already generates enough revenue to fund public education and public health without imposing an individual income tax.

In addition, the proposed constitutional amendment would help pay for the franchise tax or create legal challenges regarding the definition of an "individual" because the legislative intent of the joint resolution is clearly to prohibit a state income tax on the incomes of natural persons.

Conceivably, Proposition 4 is unnecessary because the Texas Constitution already includes a high bar for imposing a personal income tax by requiring that it be approved by a majority of voters in a statewide referendum.

Explicitly prohibiting an income tax in the Texas Constitution could eliminate a potentially valuable source of revenue for future Texas Revenue from an individual income tax would increase with economic growth and in the future could help reduce the tax burden on Texas businesses, which currently pay a higher

proportion of taxes in Texas than in other states.

Constitutionally prohibiting an income tax would constrain the state's ability to fund education and close off a potential avenue for property or sales tax relief. It also would reduce options for creating a less regressive tax system.

Because the proposition lacks a definition for the word "individual" and fails to specify that the income tax prohibition refers exclusively to natural persons, it could invite an interpretation that businesses should be legally considered individuals and therefore exempt from state taxation.

In 1991, voters approved an amendment that lets the Legislature impose a personal income tax only if a statewide referendum is approved by voters and if the new revenue goes to school property tax cuts and education programs.

The proposition seems to help ensure that Texas doesn't ever have a state income tax.

A "yes" vote supports adding verbiage to the Texas constitution that will make it harder for future legislatures to give us a State tax.

A "yes" vote supports this amendment to prohibit the state from levying an income tax on individuals.

A "no" vote opposes this amendment, thus continuing to allow the state to enact a tax on individuals in the future through a statewide referendum.

Other propositions on the ballot are:

Proposition 1: Allowing municipal court judges to hold office in more than one municipality.

Proposition 2: Allowing TWDB to issue more water development project bonds.

Proposition 3: Allowing temporary property tax exemptions after a disaster.

Proposition 4: Dedicating sporting goods sales tax revenue to LPAD and HRC.

Proposition 5: Increasing QPRT's bond authority from \$3 billion to \$6 billion.

Proposition 6: Increasing increased distributions to Available School Fund.

Proposition 7: Creating the Flood Infrastructure Fund.

Proposition 8: Exempting precious metals held in Texas depositories from property taxes.

Proposition 9: Allowing retired law enforcement annual transfer without fee.

Shadowboxing between County Judge and Sheriff, a damp squib

Fort Bend County Commissioners' Court on Tuesday considered a legal provision in the Texas Constitution that would result in the removal of Fort Bend County Sheriff Troy Nehls from his elected office.

After a closed discussion, no action was taken and the County Judge said it was an informational item.

Article 16, Section 65 of the Constitution of the State of Texas calls for automatic resignation of an elected official on becoming a candidate for another office.

"If any of the officers named (like the sheriff) herein shall announce their candidacy, or shall in fact become a candidate, in any General, Special or Primary Election, for any office of profit or trust under the laws of this State or the United States other than the office then held, at any time when the unexpired term of the office then held shall exceed one year and 30 days, such announcement or such candidacy shall constitute an automatic resignation of the office then held, and the

vacancy thereby created shall be filled pursuant to law in the same manner as other vacancies for such office are filled."

This item was added as addendum to the agenda for Consultation with attorney in closed session.

Nehls announced a few days ago that he has formed an "exploratory committee" to run for Congressional District 22.

The question is whether the appointment of an exploratory committee is deemed an announcement that he would run for Congressional District 22.

Nehls believes he has not made a formal announcement and hence, the automatic resignation rule doesn't apply.

If he makes the announcement after Dec. 1, his unexpired term will be less than one year and 30 days and consequently, he need not resign.

A couple of hours ahead of the scheduled commissioners court meeting at 1 p.m. on Tuesday, Nehls tweeted that the Democratic County Judge was planning to remove him

and even discussed a possible Democrat to replace him. Nehls said he has not violated any law and it was "a witch hunt" by the Democratic Party.

The tweet spread like wild fire and the sheriff's allegation made headlines on all local TV channels.

No one would like to wait to see what happens in Commissioners' Court before splashing the story.

County Judge KP George did not plan a witch hunt, but wanted a clarification since many people had questions about Nehls' position. The earliest thing would have been for the county judge to consult the county attorney and his advisory would have been quoted.

But, George chose to include it as an agenda item and elevated the non-issue into a political probe. Thus he gave an opening for Nehls to make political hay out of it.

George had to explain that he was not indulging in a witch hunt, but was merely seeking information from the county attorney. Thus, the predicted political gambit ended as a damp squib.
