On October 28, 2021, the Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations in the complaint and supplemental complaint you filed, dated October 1, 2019, and October 29, 2019, respectively. Based on that complaint and supplement, and information provided by the respondent, the Commission determined to dismiss the allegations that Troy Nehls violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). Accordingly, on October 28, 2021, the Commission closed the file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). One or more Statements of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision may follow.
