Dear Mses. Chlopak and Gonsalves-Brown:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated October 25, 2019, but there was an insufficient number of votes to determine whether or not there was reason to believe that Respondents violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). Accordingly, on September 6, 2022, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision is enclosed.
