The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated November 6, 2019, but there was an insufficient number of votes for the Commission to determine whether or not there was reason to believe that Respondents violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). Accordingly, on September 6, 2022, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision is enclosed.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters*, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
