Dear Mr. Elias:

On December 11 and 27, 2019, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Peters for Michigan and Geraldine Buckles in her official capacity as treasurer (the "Committee") of two complaints alleging that they may have violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). On February 15, 2022, the Commission considered the complaints but there was an insufficient number of votes to find no reason to believe that your client violated the Act and Commission regulations. Accordingly, on February 17, 2022, the Commission closed its files in these matters. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to these cases will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
