Dear Ms. Arnold:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaints dated December 4 and December 19, 2019, but was there was an insufficient number of votes to find no reason to believe or dismiss the allegations, and the Commission was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that Gary Peters, Peters for Michigan and Geraldine Buckles in her official capacity as treasurer, VoteVets Action Fund, and Majority Forward violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended and Commission regulations. Accordingly, on February17, 2022, the Commission closed the files in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to these cases will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
