Dear Mr. Elias:

On December 27, 2019, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Majority Forward, of a complaint alleging that they may have violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). On February 15, 2022, the Commission considered the complaint but there was an insufficient number of votes to find no reason to believe or dismiss the allegations, and the Commission was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that your client violated the Act and Commission regulations. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in the matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
