## SIXTH CONSENT TO EXTEND THE TIME TO COMMENCE A CIVIL LAW ENFORCEMENT ACTION, SUIT, OR PROCEEDING

In order to provide for a possible resolution of this matter through pre-probable cause conciliation, Respondents, Steven Palazzo and Palazzo for Congress and Paul Kilgore in his official capacity as treasurer, hereby consent to toll the statute of limitations for any civil action, suit, or proceeding that the Federal Election Commission might institute in connection with MUR 7680 pursuant to 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a) for an additional period of one hundred twenty (120) days.

This agreement will extend the time to institute a civil law enforcement suit for an additional period of one hundred twenty (120) days from the expiration date of the five-year statute of limitations found at 28 U.S.C. § 2462, or any other statute of limitations or repose that may be applicable in this matter. This Consent supplements the Consent to Extend Time to Institute a Civil Law Enforcement Suit by ninety (90) days, signed by Gregg Harper on March 19, 2021; a Second Consent to extend the time by fourteen (14) days signed by Gregg Harper on April 29, 2021; a Third Consent to extend the time by sixty (60) days signed by Gregg Harper on July 12, 2021; a Fourth Consent to extend the time by ninety (90) days signed by Gregg Harper on November 3, 2021; and a Fifth Consent to extend the time by one hundred twenty (120) days signed by Gregg Harper on January 29, 2024.

There shall be no additional consent to extend the time to institute a civil law enforcement suit without the written consent of the Respondents.
