Dear Mr. Reiff and Mr. Mitrani:

On January 22, February 14, and March 13, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, VoteVets Action Fund, of a complaint and supplements to that complaint alleging that it had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act").

On February 15, 2022, the Commission considered the complaint and supplements but there was an insufficient number of votes to find no reason to believe or dismiss the allegations, and the Commission was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that your client violated the Act or Commission regulations by making excessive contributions. Accordingly, on February 17, 2022, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision will follow.
