On January 23, 2020, and February 14, 2020, the Federal Election Commission (“Commission”) notified your clients, Jeff Coleman, Jeff Coleman for Congress, Inc., and Joseph Johnson in his official capacity as treasurer, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the complaint was previously forwarded to your clients.

Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint, and information supplied by the respondents, the Commission voted to dismiss the allegations and close the file in these matters on November 9, 2021. A Factual and Legal Analysis or Statement(s) of Reasons, which more fully explain the Commission’s decision, will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
