The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated March 2, 2020, and on the basis of the information contained in the complaint and responses as well as publicly available information, voted to dismiss the allegations that Better Future Michigan, John James, and John James for Senate and Timothy Caughlin in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a) by making or accepting prohibited in-kind contributions. Accordingly, on March 8, 2022, the Commission closed the file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016. A Statement of Reasons may follow.
