Dear Mr. Avers and Ms. Brouckaert:

On January 29 and March 12, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Better Future Michigan and Victoria Sachs, of complaints alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On March 8, 2022, the Commission, on the basis of the information contained in the complaint and responses as well as other publicly available information, dismissed the allegations that Better Future Michigan violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a) and that Better Future Michigan and Victoria Sachs violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1). Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons may follow.
