Dear Ms. Utrecht and Mr. Clark:

On August 9, 2021, you were notified that the Federal Election Commission found reason to believe that your client, Big Tent Project Fund, violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102, 30103, and 30104 by failing to register and report as a political committee and report its independent expenditures as a political committee, and violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(4)(H)(iii), (b)(5)(A), and (g)(1) by failing to report independent expenditures as a political committee, provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On September 28, 2021, you submitted a response to the Commission's reason to believe findings. After considering the circumstances of the matter, the Commission determined on January 14, 2025, to take no further action as to Big Tent Project Fund and to dismiss the allegations that your client, Jonathan Kott, violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102, 30103, and 30104 by failing to register Big Tent Project Fund as a political committee and file periodic disclosure reports, and voted to close the file in this matter effective March 10, 2025. Any applicable Statements of Reasons available at the time of this letter's transmittal are enclosed.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record today. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
