SUBJECT: MUR 7738 (Americans for Progressive Action USA, *et al.*)

RE: Circulation of Discovery Documents – Subpoenas

Attached, for the Commission’s approval, are subpoenas to produce documents and orders to submit written answers directed to Twitter, Inc., Namecheap, Inc., and Apple Inc. On March 22, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe that Americans for Progressive Action USA and Evan Jones in his official capacity as treasurer (the “Committee”), Evan Jones in his personal capacity, and Unknown Respondent violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b) by filing false disclosure reports.¹ The Commission also approved the use of compulsory process.²

As discussed at the March 22, 2022 Executive Session, subpoenas are necessary in order to identify the true identity of the person who filed the false disclosure reports with the

1 Commission. The Office of General Counsel completed steps one and two of the investigative
 2 plan sent via email to the Commission on March 25, 2022.³ We received responses from three
 3 persons at addresses used by the Committee, confirming that names and/or addresses on the
 4 disclosure reports filed with the Commission appear to be fictitious.⁴ However, we have not
 5 received a response from the Committee or Evan Jones.⁵

 7 We have identified three entities which may have personal identifying information for the
 8 person who filed the false disclosure reports: Twitter, Inc., Namecheap, Inc., and Apple Inc.
 9 The entities we recommend subpoenaing will only provide the information the Commission
 10 seeks via subpoena.⁶ The goal of these subpoenas is to obtain information that will enable us to
 11 identify the individual who filed the false disclosure reports with the Commission. The attached
 12 subpoenas are similar to, but narrower, than subpoenas previously approved by the Commission
 13 in MUR 7194 (Unknown Respondent).⁷

 15 **Twitter, Inc.**

16 There are several Twitter accounts which appear to be run by or affiliated with the
 17 Committee.⁸ We recommend the Commission approve subpoenas requesting the account
 18 subscriber information for: @ AFPA_USA; @ProgressiveFor; @basslp2, @Christo27267724,
 19 and @chrisullivan210. @AFPA_USA's account page indicates that it is the official Twitter page

1 of the Committee. The @ProgressiveFor account lists progressiveactionusa.org as the domain
 2 name associated with the account. Progressiveactionusa.org is the same domain name that Evan
 3 Jones used for his email address and contact information on the disclosure reports filed with the
 4 Commission. The profile of @ProgressiveFor states that it was founded by Christopher M. Bass
 5 and Chris Sullivan, which are two names that also appear on the disclosure reports filed with the
 6 Commission. @Christo27267724 and @chrisullivan210 appear to be the personal Twitter
 7 handles for the Chris Sullivan listed on the disclosure reports and listed on the @ProgressiveFor
 8 Twitter page. @basslp2 is an associated Twitter page with links and retweets to the
 9 @ProgressiveFor page. @basslp2 appears to be the Twitter page for Bass Energy, Inc. — a
 10 company that shares the name of one of the contributors to AFPUSA on its disclosure reports.

12 **Namecheap, Inc.**

13 The person that filed the disclosure reports with the Commission under the name Evan
 14 Jones used three email address. Two of the email addresses are at the same domain
 15 progressusa.org: ejones@progressusa.org and info@progressusa.org. The progressusa.org
 16 domain name is registered to an entity named Namecheap, Inc. and the registration information
 17 is withheld by a third-party service provider named Withheld for Privacy based in Iceland.
 18 Namecheap will only provide the registration information under subpoena.⁹

19 **Apple Inc.**

20 The other email address used by the person that filed the disclosure reports with the
 21 Commission under the name Evan Jones were apple icloud account email addresses:
 22 [REDACTED] and

23 [REDACTED] Apple will similarly not share information without a
 24 subpoena.¹⁰

25 Accordingly, we request that the Commission approve the attached subpoenas.
