On June 18, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Casey Askar, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the complaint was forwarded to your client at that time. On April 26, 2022, the Commission considered the allegations contained in the complaint but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that Casey Askar accepted prohibited corporate contributions in violation of 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 114.2(d), and to find reason to believe that Casey Askar accepted excessive contributions in violation of 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.9. On November 17, 2022, the Commission voted to close the file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision is not required in this matter, but if one is issued, it will be provided to you.
