Dear Ms. Brinson:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated August 4, 2020. On May 24, 2022, the Commission considered the complaint but was equally divided on whether to find no reason to believe that Hirsh Singh and Singh for Senate and Elizabeth Curtis in her official capacity as treasurer (the “Committee”) violated 52 U.S.C. § 30120(a)(1) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.11(a) by failing to include required disclaimers. The Commission was also equally divided on whether to find no reason to believe that Hirsh Singh and the Committee violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b) by failing to disclose in-kind contributions from Shore News Network and Phil Stilton. Finally, the Commission was equally divided on whether to find no reason to believe that Shore News Network and Recall Murphy/Conservative NJ violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102, 30103, and 30104 by failing to register and report as a political committee. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter on May 26, 2020.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission’s decision is not required in this matter, but if one is issued, it will be provided to you.

The Federal Election Campaign Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission’s dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8). If you have any questions, please contact Richard Weiss, the attorney assigned to this matter, at (202) 694-1021.
