The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated August 17, 2020, but there was an insufficient number of votes to find no reason to believe or dismiss, and the Commission was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that Fight for the American Dream PAC and Megan Troy in her official capacity as treasurer violated the Act or Commission regulations by making an excessive in-kind contribution or by failing to report an in-kind contribution. Accordingly, on February 17, 2022, the Commission closed the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act, as amended allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
