Dear Mr. Reiff and Mr. Mitrani:

On August 18, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients, Fight for the American Dream PAC and Megan Troy in her official capacity as treasurer, of a complaint alleging that they had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On February 15, 2022, the Commission considered the complaint but there was an insufficient number of votes to find no reason to believe or dismiss, and the Commission was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that your clients violated the Act or Commission regulations by making an excessive in-kind contribution or by failing to report an in-kind contribution. Accordingly, on February 17, 2022, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons explaining the Commission's decision will follow.
