- g. Approve the Factual and Legal Analyses, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated April 8, 2021.
- h. Authorize the use of compulsory process.
- i. Approve the appropriate letters.

- h. Issue appropriate letters.

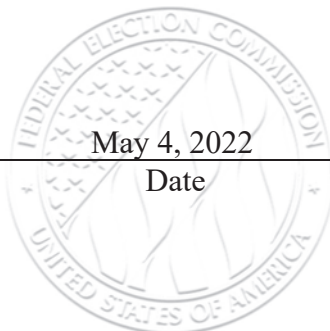
Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, and Trainor voted affirmatively for the motion.
