I, Vicktoria J. Allen, recording secretary of the Federal Election Commission executive session, do hereby certify that on July 14, 2022, the Commission took the following actions, subject to the Errata dated April 14, 2021, in the above-captioned matter:

1. Decided by a vote of 5-1 to:
 - a. Dismiss the allegation that John James and Renaissance Global Logistics, LLC violated 52 U.S.C. § 30125(e)(1) by soliciting, receiving, directing, transferring, or spending non-federal funds in violation of the Act in connection with an election for federal office.
 - b. Approve the relevant sections of the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated March 31, 2021, and as last circulated by Commissioner Cooksey's Office on July 7, 2022 at 2:19 p.m.

Commissioners Broussard, Cooksey, Dickerson, Trainor, and Walther voted affirmatively for the decision. Commissioner Weintraub dissented.

2. Decided by a vote of 5-1 to:
 - a. Dismiss the allegation that John James, John James for Senate, and Timothy Caughlin in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) by accepting an excessive in-kind contribution in the form of coordinated communications.

- b. Dismiss the allegation that Outside PAC and Julie Dozier in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(a) by making an excessive in-kind contribution in the form of coordinated communications.
- c. Approve the relevant sections of the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated March 31, 2021, as last circulated by Commissioner Cooksey's Office on July 7, 2022 at 2:19 p.m.,
- d. Approve the appropriate letters.
- e. Close the file.

Commissioners Broussard, Cooksey, Dickerson, Trainor, and Walther voted affirmatively for the decision. Commissioner Weintraub dissented.
