Dear Messrs. Burns and Woodson:

On October 28, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Twitter, Inc., of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. On June 22, 2021, the Commission found, on the basis of the information in the complaint, and information provided by your client, that there is no reason to believe that Twitter, Inc., violated 52 U.S.C. § 30118(a) by making prohibited in-kind corporate contributions. Accordingly, on August 31, 2021, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons further explaining the basis for the Commission's decision will follow.
