The Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations contained in your complaint received on November 20, 2020, but there was an insufficient number of votes to dismiss the allegations that Jobs and Progress Fund, Inc. violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102, 30103, and 30104 and to find no reason to believe that Vaughn Church, Thomas Norris, and Mark Miller violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102, 30103, and 30104 in their individual or official capacities. Accordingly, on October 28, 2021, the Commission closed its file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision is not required in this matter, but if one is issued, it will be provided to you.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters*, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
