On November 30, 2020, the Federal Election Commission notified your clients Jobs and Progress Fund, Inc., Thomas Norris, Vaughn Church, and Mark Miller, of a complaint alleging that they had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Copies of the complaint were forwarded to your clients at the time.

On October 28, 2021, the Commission considered the complaint, but there was an insufficient number of votes to dismiss the allegations that Jobs and Progress Fund, Inc. violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102, 30103, and 30104 and to find no reason to believe that Vaughn Church, Thomas Norris, and Mark Miller violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102, 30103, and 30104 in their individual or official capacities. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016), effective September 1, 2016.
