Dear Mr. Crosland:

On December 23, 2020, the Federal Election Commission (“Commission”) notified your client, Make America Great Again PAC and Bradley T. Crate in his official capacity as treasurer, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended.

On March 24, 2022, and April 5, 2022, the Commission considered the complaint, but no motion dismissing the allegation that Make America Great Again PAC and Bradley T. Crate in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30104(b) and 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3(a) and 110.9 by knowingly accepting and failing to report excessive contributions received the requisite four votes. Accordingly, on August 8, 2022, the Commission voted to close the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission’s decision is not required in this matter, but if one is issued, it will be provided to you.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
