Dear Ms. Gonsalves-Brown:

The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated February 17, 2021, but was equally divided on whether to find reason to believe that NRA Victory Fund, Inc., and Christina M. Majors in her official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b)(3)(A) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a)(4) by failing to report employer and occupation information for individual contributors. The Commission was also equally divided on dismissing the allegations. Accordingly, on June 23, 2022, the Commission voted to close the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision is not required in this matter, but if one is issued, it will be provided to you.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8). If you have any questions,
