SUBJECT: MUR 7886 (Astellas Pharma U.S., Inc.)

Recommendation to Accept Signed Conciliation Agreement

On January 7, 2022, the Commission approved a conciliation offer to Astellas Pharma U.S., Inc. ("Astellas") to settle violations of 52 U.S.C. § 30119(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 115.2(a) by making prohibited federal contractor contributions.

In addition, at the time the Commission found reason to believe as to Astellas, it took no action as to a recipient committee, Senate Leadership Fund and Caleb Crosby in his official capacity as treasurer ("SLF"). We did not learn any additional information regarding SLF during conciliation negotiations with Astellas. Therefore, we now recommend that the Commission dismiss the allegation that SLF violated 52 U.S.C. § 30119(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 115.2(c) by knowingly soliciting a federal contractor contribution and close the file.

RECOMMENDATIONS:

- 1. Accept the attached conciliation agreement with Astellas Pharma U.S., Inc.;
- 2. Dismiss the allegation that the Senate Leadership Fund and Caleb Crosby in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30119(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 115.2(c) by knowingly soliciting a federal contractor contribution;
- 3. Approve the appropriate letters; and
- 4. Close the file.
