Dear Mr. Josefiak and Mr. Bayes:

On March 24, 2021, the Federal Election Commission notified your client, Senate Leadership Fund and Caleb Crosby in his official capacity as treasurer ("SLF"), of a complaint alleging that it had violated certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the complaint was forwarded to your client at that time. Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint, and information supplied by you, the Commission, on May 9, 2022, voted to dismiss the allegation that SLF violated 52 U.S.C. § 30119(a)(2) and 11 C.F.R. § 115.2(c) by knowingly soliciting a federal contractor contribution.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).
