Dear Mr. Jentgens:

On March 22, 2021, the Federal Election Commission notified Americans for Prosperity Action and you, as treasurer, of a complaint alleging violations of certain sections of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. A copy of the complaint was forwarded to you at that time. Upon further review of the allegations contained in the complaint, and information supplied by you, the Commission, on March 16, 2022, voted to dismiss the allegation that Americans for Prosperity Action and Robert Jentgens in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30119(a)(2) by knowingly soliciting federal contractor contributions

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days.
