This is in reference to the complaint you filed with the Federal Election Commission on March 17, 2021, concerning Service Tire Truck Centers, Inc. Based on that complaint and information provided by the Respondents, on January 11, 2022, the Commission voted to dismiss the allegations against Service Tire Truck Centers, Inc. in this matter as an act of prosecutorial discretion. The Commission further voted to find no reason to believe that Senate Leadership Fund and Caleb Crosby in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30119(a)(2) by knowingly soliciting a prohibited federal contractor contribution.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702. In addition, a Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision is may follow.

The Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended, allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
