SUBJECT: MUR 7899 (Democratic Executive Committee of Florida) – Recommendation to Accept Signed Conciliation Agreement

On March 8, 2022, the Commission found reason to believe that the Committee violated 11 C.F.R. § 106.7(d)(1) and approved a pre-probable cause conciliation agreement addressing that violation as well as violations of 52 U.S.C. §§ 30104(b), 30104(e)(2), 30116(f) and 30118(a),
