Dear Mr. Kokesh:

In the normal course of carrying out its supervisory responsibilities, the Federal Election Commission became aware of information suggesting that you may have violated the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended (the "Act"). On July 28, 2022, the Commission notified you of these allegations.

On December 15, 2022, the Commission considered this matter, but the Commission was evenly divided as to whether to (1) find reason to believe that you knowingly accepted prohibited contributions in violation of 52 U.S.C. § 30121(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.20, or (2) find no reason to believe that you knowingly accepted prohibited contributions in violation of 52 U.S.C. § 30121(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.20. Accordingly, the Commission closed its file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016). A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.
