The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated May 14, 2021, and dismissed the allegations that the Wyss Foundation, the Berger Action Fund, Inc., Sixteen Thirty Fund, The Hub Project, New Venture Fund, and the Hub Education and Engagement Fund violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30102, 30103, and 30104, provisions of the Federal Election Campaign Act of 1971, as amended. Additionally, there was an insufficient number of votes to dismiss or find no reason to believe as to the allegations that Hansjörg Wyss, the Wyss Foundation, the Berger Action Fund, Inc., the Sixteen Thirty Fund, and New Venture Fund made foreign national contributions and contributions in the name of another. Accordingly, on July 28, 2022, the Commission closed its file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision will follow.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters*, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8). If you have any questions, please contact me at (202) 694-1650.
