Dear Ms. Reynolds:

On August 30, 2022, the Federal Election Commission reviewed the allegations in your complaint dated October 20, 2021 and found that on the basis of the information provided in the complaint, and information provided in the response, there is no reason to believe Xochitl for New Mexico and Joshua Orozco in his official capacity as treasurer, Xochitl Torres Small, and Karen S. Mendenhall violated 52 U.S.C. § 30114 and 11 C.F.R. § 113.2 by converting campaign funds to personal use or that Xochitl for New Mexico and Joshua Orozco in his official capacity as treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b) by reporting the purpose of its payments to The Mendenhall Firm, P.C. as “legal services.” Accordingly, on August 30, 2022, the Commission closed the file in this matter.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission’s decision in this matter. *See* 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8).
