The Federal Election Commission has considered the allegations contained in your complaint dated October 22, 2021, but was equally divided on whether to dismiss the allegations that: Save America Stop Socialism PAC and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. §§ 30104(a), 30116(a), and 30120(a) and 11 C.F.R. §§ 104.3(b), 110.2(b), and 110.11; Marjorie Taylor Greene and Greene for Congress and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.9; and Greene for Congress and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and (b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a). Accordingly, on September 28, 2022, the Commission voted to close the file in this matter. A Statement of Reasons providing a basis for the Commission's decision is not required in this matter, but if one is issued, it will be provided to you.

Documents related to the case will be placed on the public record within 30 days. *See* Disclosure of Certain Documents in Enforcement and Other Matters, 81 Fed. Reg. 50,702 (Aug. 2, 2016).

The Federal Election Campaign Act allows a complainant to seek judicial review of the Commission's dismissal of this action. See 52 U.S.C. § 30109(a)(8). If you have any questions,
