CERTIFICATION

I, Vicktoria J. Allen, recording secretary of the Federal Election Commission executive session, do hereby certify that on September 28, 2022, the Commission took the following actions in the above-captioned matter:

1. Failed by a vote of 3-3 to:
 - a. Dismiss as an exercise of prosecutorial discretion the allegation that Save America Stop Socialism PAC and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.2(b) by making an excessive in-kind contribution and send a letter of caution to the Committee.
 - b. Dismiss as an exercise of prosecutorial discretion the allegation that Save America Stop Socialism PAC and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104 (a) and (b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(b) by failing to report making an in-kind contribution and send a letter of caution to the Committee.
 - c. Dismiss as an exercise of prosecutorial discretion the allegation that Save America Stop Socialism PAC and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30120(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.11 by failing to include an adequate disclaimer and send a letter of caution to the Committee.
 - d. Dismiss as an exercise of prosecutorial discretion the allegation that Marjorie Taylor Greene and Greene for Congress and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C.

§ 30116(f) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.9 by knowingly accepting an excessive in-kind contribution and send a letter of caution to the Committee.

- e. Dismiss as an exercise of prosecutorial discretion the allegation that Greene for Congress and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and (b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a) by failing to report receiving a contribution and send a letter of caution to the Committee.
- f. Approve the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated July 28, 2022.
- g. Approve the appropriate letters.
- h. Close the file.

Commissioners Broussard, Lindenbaum, and Weintraub voted affirmatively for the motion. Commissioners Cooksey, Dickerson, and Trainor dissented.

2. Failed by a vote of 3-3 to:

- a. Dismiss as an exercise of prosecutorial discretion the allegation that Save America Stop Socialism PAC and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30116(a) and 11 C.F.R. § 110.2(b) by making an excessive in-kind contribution.

- e. Dismiss as an exercise of prosecutorial discretion the allegation that Greene for Congress and Jason D. Boles in his official capacity as Treasurer violated 52 U.S.C. § 30104(a) and (b) and 11 C.F.R. § 104.3(a) by failing to report receiving a contribution.
- f. Approve the Factual and Legal Analysis, as recommended in the First General Counsel's Report dated July 28, 2022, subject to the edits as last circulated by Chairman Dickerson's Office on Monday, September 26, 2022 at 10:58 a.m.
- g. Approve the appropriate letters.
- h. Close the file.
